Application Instructions

Use the lower application rate for light infestations and the higher listed rate for heavy infestations.

Make applications to wet turf. This is accomplished most easily in the early morning while turf is covered with dew or irrigate the application area with 0.1 inches of water prior to application.

Apply 0.1 to 0.5 inches of water within 1 hour of application of this product to move it through the thatch. Irrigation before this product has dried on the turf will provide the best results.

Make applications in 2 gallons of water per 1,000 square feet of turf. If lower application volumes are used, begin irrigation as soon as possible after application.

Applications of this product in combination with an appropriately labeled and compatible soil and/or foliar fungicide may prove beneficial in reducing fungal infections following nematode feeding.

Restrictions:

Do not apply more than 0.067 lb. abamectin/A (12.2 fl. oz. RightLine NEMAMECTIN 0.7 SC) per application.

CURATIVE SPOT TREATMENTS ON GOLF COURSE TEES, FAIRWAYS AND GREENS

Use curative spot treatments for control of nematodes over smaller areas where outbreaks are severe or expected to become severe. Curative spot treatments are made by applying the highest labeled dose of this product (12.2 fl. oz.) and repeat up to 4 times. Do not make repeat applications sooner than 14 days from the last application. When making curative spot treatments, treat no more than 10,000 sq. ft. per acre per year.
